

About Asist - Who we are



Since July 1994, Asist has delivered one-to-one, issue-based advocacy services to people with learning disabilities, physical disabilities and/or mental health conditions.



This service has developed over the years and offers advocacy support to people in Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent.



Asist provides:

- Independent Mental Capacity Advocacy service (IMCA)
- Independent Mental Health Act Advocacy service (IMHA)
- Care Act and NHS Complaints.





Asist also offers advocacy through a number of specialist projects including BAME and Parents Advocacy as well as Community Advocacy for groups of people.

Asist is nationally recognised for developing, writing and promoting the **Watching Brief** guidance which outlines the core principles for all Non-Instructed Advocacy support services across the UK.
